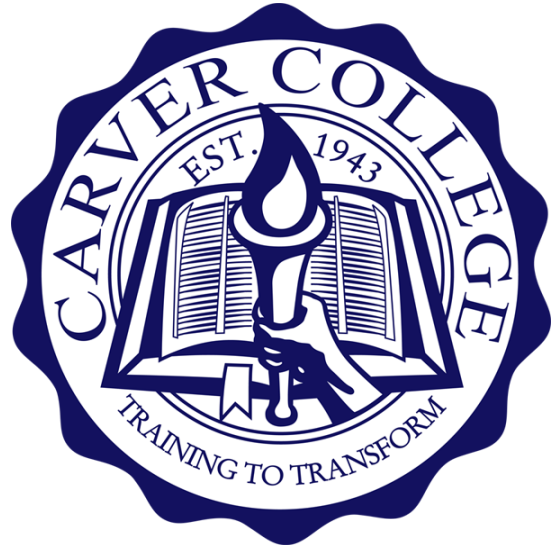

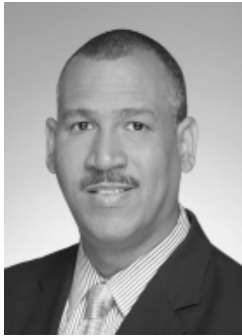

General Fee: All students pay a \$125 general fee. (Note: this fee includes library fee, classroom supplies fee, home Cougar games etc.)

Campus Information System Fee: All students pay a \$150 CIS fee, which gives students access to online course info, unofficial transcripts, personal and school calendars, reminders, degree audits, file storage, email, and more.

Housing Fee: On campus single students pay a housing fee of \$2,400 per semester. On campus students are required to take 12 or more hours of classes each semester. We are unable to provide married/family housing at this time. Please contact the Student Affairs office for local housing opportunities.

Miscellaneous Fees: Non-refundable New Students Application Fee - \$35 (US)/\$50 (non-US); Late Registration Fee - \$20; Add/drop/change fee - \$20.

Christian, co-educational, private, nondenominational, two-year and four year college.

2 Resident faculty; 13 adjunct faculty; 90% hold Master degrees in their fields, 33% hold Doctorate degrees in their field.
